#### 3. Chair's report

I'll start as I usually do with a huge thank you to all of the RSC-FST committee with particular thanks for those with officer roles – Phil as Secretary and Vivian as Treasurer. In 2022 we have seen the return of inperson events and it was fantastic to be together for MiBio2022 and Formulative Formulation III. We have

also continued our award-winning formula to host online events too; Testing of Personal Care and Modelling and Simulation in Formulations. These high quality, scientific meetings, provided networking opportunities and brought in speakers and delegates from far and wide. Across these conferences we have once again being working alongside other RSC interest groups and the wider formulation community, SCI and CCP5, to deliver out events. During this year we have also actively engaged with both the Analytical Science Community Council and the Organic Chemistry Community Council which is something new for us brought about through the RSC supporting closer engagement between interest groups and subject communities. We remain actively involved in the EUChemS Working Party in Formulation in Chemistry which was set up in 2017 to connect the formulation community across the world and is a legacy from the INFORM Project (Integrating Nanomaterials in Formulations) which was a coordination action from 2009-2012 and very much about the exchange of knowledge on the use of nanostructured formulated products across world regions (Europe, Asia Pacific, America). Ten years on from INFORM this legacy from such a successful project is fantastic and we are excited for Formula XI in Lille in July.

Topics for all our meetings are in line with key formulation areas and steered by committee members. This next year will see a drive from the RSC-FST on sustainability which clearly features across the RSC strategies and is a key national challenge. We are excited for Sustainability in Personal Care, Innovations in Encapsulation, Automation for a Sustainable Society, Formula XI and MiBio2023 all planned for 2023. Particular thanks goes to all those involved in organising, running, promoting and supporting all our activities.

As always we continue to support the RSC vision around an inclusive, collaborative science culture and we commit to do what we can to support this. The RSC-FST is clear about our expectations within from our committee members and participants in our events in terms of behaviours and attitudes to ensure all we do is welcoming and inclusive to all.

Our interest group remains very much in the black in terms of finances (~£100k) and we are always keen to hear how we can spend some of our funds for effective support of the formulation community. In 2022 we spent some funds on some handheld digital microscopes and magnifying glasses and I delivered a school session on formulated products as part of British Science Week.

Our drive and purpose remains very much in line with the RSC to advance the chemical sciences and is about bringing the formulation community together. We are excited about the new influx of energy and ideas brought to us from our 4 new committee members following our recent call for ballot.

On a personal note I just want to end by saying thank you to all those who have served alongside me and although we have to say goodbye from the committee from a number of our long-standing members we will undoubtedly continue to engage with them through our activities. I wish you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

#### 4. Treasurers report (Jan 2023 End)

Bernadeta Pochopien reported that there are funds of £30,577.20 in the NatWest current account at the end of 2022.

There is £77,650.25 in a "high" interest account.

Total funds £108,227.45. This is up from £105,780.71 at the start of 2022.
